## WHAT NOT TO BRING


Electronic devices of any kind, fireworks, alcohol, tobacco, drugs, weapons, jewelry, clothes that question modesty, bad attitude.

## DIRECTIONS

From Albany - Go north on I-87 to Exit 30. Take Rt. 73, then 86W to Saranac Lake. Go straight as Rt. 86 turns into Rt. 3 South toward Tupper Lake. Follow Rt. 3 to Rt. 40 North. Turn right on Rt. 30 North and continue 3 miles to Gilpin Bay Road and Camp Cherokee sign (adjacent to Niagara Mohawk substation). Turn right, go <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> miles on dirt road to camp.

From Syracuse - Take I-81 North past Watertown to Exit 48. Take Rt. 342 to Black River. Turn left onto Rt. 3 and continue east to Tupper Lake. Proceed to Rt. 3 & 30 approximately 5 miles where Rt. 30 turns north. Turn left and continue 3 miles to Gilpin Bay Road and Camp Cherokee sign (the camp road is the first right past Young Life's Saranac Village). Cherokee is 3/4 mile on dirt road to camp.





## **IMPORTANT INFORMATION**

#### PRE REGISTRATION & EARLY BIRD DISCOUNT

Fees: For youth camps is \$483 per week. For members of the New York Conference of Seventh-day Adventist Church \$458. Non-refundable deposit is \$150. Family Camps fees: Adults are \$348, Ages 4-13 are \$291 and Ages 0-3 are free. New York Conference members will receive a \$25 discount off the total cost for the family. To expedite registration, a \$25 discount will be given to all campers or families who pay their account in full for the week by June 1. If after June 1, you may pay in full or a \$200 non-refundable deposit to reserve your spot. Place each child's name, camp and date on your check. There will be a \$45 charge for returned checks. If paying by credit card, a 3% surcharge will be added to your balance.

## REGISTRATION

Begins each Sunday at 2:00 p.m. If you arrive before lunch you may join in the noon meal by purchasing a meal ticket for \$12.00. Early financial registration is permitted if the driver is picking up/dropping off campers on the same day. The camper will still need to go through registration in order to sign up for classes. Checkout time is 9:00-10:00 a.m. on the last Sunday of camp week. If the camper is leaving with someone other than a parent, written permission is needed.

## **APPLICATION CONFIRMATION**

Those who apply at least two weeks prior to a selected camp will receive written confirmation of acceptance and will have a reserved spot. Applications received less than two weeks prior to the desired camp will only be notified if space is not available.
